Girls often do not reach their potential in math. Many girls as early as eleven years of age express a dislike (or a fear) of math, or simply underachieve in math. This leads to an underdevelopment of math skills. Early dislike of math may eventually limit their ability to enter many rewarding careers.

Mothers have a critical role to play in supporting their daughters' learning.

Through this course you will:
